and protected...

1. FREEDOM of Religion, Press, Speech, Assembly, Petition
2. RIGHT TO KEEP AND BEAR ARMS
3. No QUARTERING of soldiers in peacetime
4. NO UNREASONABLE SEARCH and SEIZURE
5. PROTECTION of ACCUSED
6. RIGHT TO A SPEEDY, PUBLIC TRIAL BY JURY
7. TRIAL BY JURY IN CIVIL SUITS
8. NO EXCESSIVE FINES or CRUEL PUNISHMENT
9. POWERS RESERVED TO THE PEOPLE
10. POWERS RESERVED TO THE STATES
