## 7 (6+1) Questions To Ask About a Work of Art

Answer the following questions on a separate page.

- 1. What is the first thing you see when you look at this picture?
  - a. What are two or three ways the artist focuses you on this part of the painting?
- 2. Look at the lines in the painting. Where do they converge? Do they seem to aim at anything/draw your eye to anything? If so what?
- 3. List the objects or people you see in the picture.
  - a. Which objects/people take up the most actual space?
  - b. How much space?
- 4. What colors dominate the picture? How does the artist use color?
  - a. Are there stark contrasts or are the colors blended?
- 5. Based on your answers above, summarize the painting's subject matter in a sentence.
  - a. What does the painter seem to think about his/her subject? (Does s/he like it? Dislike it? Is this hopeful? dubious? fearful? optimistic? adoring? overwhelmed?...)
- 6. Look at the title and at any clues about the time period.
  - a. What does the title add to your understanding of the painting?
  - b. How does your knowledge of the time period add to what you understand in the painting?
- 7. Is this work reflecting an America of the people for the people or an America of the elite for the elite?
  - a. (What would your historical & literary people say about this?)
